Enjoy these landings at airports around the world.



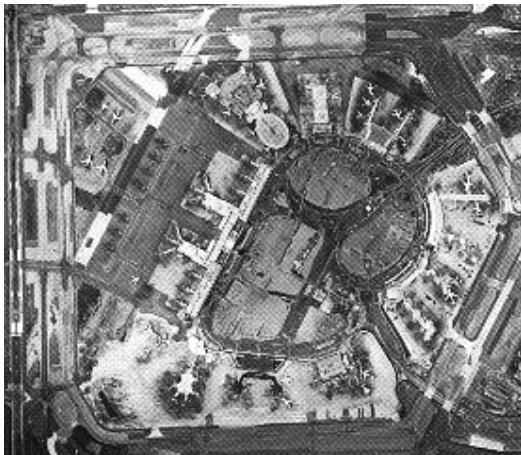
Terminal 4 at J F Kennedy International, formerly known as the International arrivals terminal, with its Ground Control building
